

CASSIA HUDGINS' SUBMISSION TO TORONTO REVIEW COMMITTEE

I'm writing this testimony in response to the Warning letter of quarantine issued against Brother Titus and some of the full-time workers.

Growing up in the church life, there have always been older brothers who gave themselves for the going on of the other saints. They put aside who they are to follow the Lord out of a pure heart for the sole purpose of helping others to do the same. In a number of different ways, whether ministering through practical or spiritual needs, these ones have always been there to nourish, strengthen, and encourage the saints in their Christian walk with the Lord. Among many, I count Brother Titus Chu to be such a one.
